

Conversation code of conduct for the National Trust (NSW) Blog

The National Trust (NSW) welcomes and encourages comments on our blogs. We publish blogs to increase appreciation, awareness and understanding of heritage and conservation; provide a forum for respectful and open debate and discussion; and share expertise and knowledge. There are some instances where comments will be edited or deleted and they are as follows:

- Comments deemed to be spam or solely promotional in nature will be deleted. This includes automated messages. This isn't a platform for a sales pitch. We welcome experts including a link to relevant content where knowledge sharing is the intent and outcome of providing the link, but comments that are off topic will be deleted.
- Comments including profanity will be deleted.
- Comments containing language or concepts that could be deemed offensive will be deleted. Note this may include abusive, threatening, pornographic, offensive, slanderous, discriminatory, misleading or defamatory language.
- Comments that attack an individual directly will be deleted.
- Comments that harass other posters will be deleted. Everyone has a valuable view. Be respectful at all times.
- Anonymous comments will be deleted. We only accept comments from posters who identify themselves.
